Registration is in our online registration portal (Community Pass). You will need to set up a family account in Community Pass if you don't already have one and you can do this at any point by going to our website at <u>www.ywcanewburyport.org</u> and clicking on the online registration button which will bring you to community pass and ask you to sign in or allow you to create an account.

Our online registration system doesn't support a 3-pronged priority, so all registrants will be automatically put onto a camp waitlist to ensure that campers are registered based on the preferences listed above. If registering during the month of March, please allow for up to 1-week to see if your registration is accepted. Once accepted, the system will email you and you will need to go into your account and pay your tuition fees. Slots will not be held without payment.

Once registered online, you will need to complete all necessary intake paperwork and return it to the Program Director by <u>June 1st</u>.

Paperwork that needs to be on file includes:

- Intake Packet
- Current record of a physical within the past year with immunizations
- Any applicable supporting documents/medications (ie. custodial orders, restraining orders, individual healthcare plans for children with allergies or medical issues, medications that will need to be kept onsite, supportive and/or adaptive plans).
